

About the project

Coinciding with the 60th Venice Art Biennale 2024, **ERA** presents **Lingua Ignota**, a specially commissioned project by established Romanian artist **Victoria Zidaru**, curated by Adina Drinceanu. The project builds on a two year program done in collaboration with the Istituto della Pietà. It is supported by Valorizzazioni Culturali Group, Romanian Cultural Institute in Venice and Ferma de Arte.

About the work

Lingua Ignota highlights Victoria Zidaru's artistic vision, which over the past four decades has reinvented and transcended historical textile art paradigms by integrating vegetal textures and olfact with conceptual and sensuous elements. Her multidisciplinary approach encompasses large scale installation, sculptures and performance.

The concept of the project expands upon the artist's vision to explore an interconnected approach to knowledge, bridging ecological, spiritual, and collective actions in an intimate and urgent dialogue with environmental justice challenges.


About the work

Lingua Ignota unfolds in two interconnected acts:

- An immersive performance on April 15th at the Archivi della Misericordia;
- A site-specific large scale installation in the garden of the Istituto della Pietà, inaugurating on May 11th and open to the public until 29 of September.

The project is complemented by **Donate a Word**, a series of collective actions through pedagogy and participation that reflect on the relationship between healing, nature, and spirituality. It is done in collaboration with **Jamaican poet Ishion Hutchinson**.

About the work

Lingua Ignota draws inspiration from writings and sonic images of Hildegard von Bingen, a 12th-century figure renowned for her mystical, theological, and ecological insights. The project's title, "Lingua Ignota," references Hildegard's innovative linguistic creation, a form of literacy aimed to reach a state of linguistic plenitude by capturing a holistic spiritual and natural wisdom.

This language, featured in her seminal work "Riesencodex," represents an early attempt at constructing a language that transcends traditional modes of expression, offering a medium for exploring the divine and the natural world.

About the artist's practice

Victoria Zidaru's artistic lexicon is deeply entrenched in the vernacular of her native Bucovina, employing vegetal materials, words, embroidery, sewing, and braiding as conduits of expression. Her practices are embedded in the rhythms and cycles of natural life and gestures of ancient rituals, emphasizing the importance of organic materials such as cords of aromatic herbs, leaves, seeds, among many others. Through her multidisciplinary practice, Zidaru advocates for a sustainable, interconnected form of knowledge, rich with the sacral undertones of ancient rituals and the organic essence of the natural world.



About the artist

Victoria Zidaru, born in 1956 in Liteni, Suceava, Romania, is an artist who expresses herself through sculpture, painting, drawing, and embroidery, favoring natural materials such as fabric, handmade paper, medicinal herbs, and leaves. In recent years, she has devoted herself to installations that utilize textile and vegetal materials to create works with strong visual-tactile and olfactory components, a practice known as Olfactory Sculpture, which is becoming increasingly relevant in the European art scene.

Zidaru graduated from the "Nicolae Grigorescu" Institute of Fine Arts in Bucharest in 1983 and is the co-founder of Ferma d'Arte, a museum and artistic and cultural residency program aimed at preserving ancient artisan techniques and passing them on to new generations. Her career includes numerous solo and group exhibitions, both nationally and internationally. Among her most notable solo exhibitions are "Il giorno primo" at MNAC, the National Museum of Contemporary Art, Bucharest, Romania (2023), "Hortus Deliciarum" at the Gallery of the Romanian Institute of Culture and Humanistic Research in Venice (2019), "Said and Sewn" (2016), and "Angels, Thrones, Lords" (2014)




About the curator

Adina Drinceanu is a curator and cultural consultant specialized in contemporary art. She earned an M.A. in Art History after beginning her career as an artist. Drinceanu has curated exhibitions across Italy, the United Kingdom, and Romania, with a particular focus on the complex interplay between art and sociopolitical phenomena such as totalitarianism and genocide.

In 2021 she co-founded ERA - Eco Research Art, a non-profit organization based in Rome, with operational bases in Venice and Città della Pieve. As president, she leads ERA's mission to harness art as a vehicle for social change and cultural enrichment, with a particular emphasis on supporting vulnerable children and promoting sustainable practices across various sectors

Since 2021, she has been serving on the advisory board of a private collection in England, assisting with acquisitions, exhibitions, and curatorial strategies.

The *Donate a Word* campaign is an ongoing art project initiated by Victoria Zidaru in collaboration with the non-profit organization ERA and Jamaican poet Ishion Hutchinson for the *Lingua Ignota* project which is being showcased during the Venice Art Biennale 2024. Although it started as an integral part of *Lingua Ignota, Donate a Word* will continue to have a life of its own, creating a legacy that extends beyond the project's duration.

This initiative invites you to share words of kindness that will be gifted to others. Some of these words will be transformed into art objects, intricately embroidered onto canvas and combined with natural elements sealed in wax. They will become part of the site-specific installation Lingua Ignota or be gifted to visitors during the show.

Additionally, contributed words are also featured on the dedicated website, <u>donateaword.org</u>, envisioned as an interactive tapestry that weaves together words, images, and sounds, allowing online visitors to explore and interact with the contributions by clicking on elements that resonate with them.

Drawing inspiration from the Romanian 'Descântec' ritual, this campaign is rooted in the belief in the transformative and therapeutic powers of verbal and symbolic expressions.

So far, contributions have been collected from children housed by the Venetian community of Istituto della Pietà, women from the Romanian village of Liteni in Bucovina, and various other communities and individuals worldwide.

ERA - Eco Research Art is a nonprofit program established in 2021 by **Adina Drinceanu**, **Jerome Bellavista Caltagirone**, and **Filippo Perissinotto**. ERA is committed to harnessing the transformative power of art to promote a culture of environmental justice. **Its vision** is to influence both public and private strategies related to eco-sustainable development, aiming to improve the lives of children, young mothers, and other vulnerable groups within specific communities.

ERA's mission involves mobilizing artists, cultural actors, and professionals across various fields to address and illuminate the particular vulnerabilities of childhood, among other issues. Through strategic philanthropy, ERA engages in social awareness and educational projects, contributing to the development of a cultural and emotional literacy on economic, social, and environmental sustainability issues.
